Our initiatives include


- Engage teachers in collaborative planning, data analysis, coaching and feedback sessions, to improve student academic performance through the implementation of differentiated and inclusive curriculum strategies.

- Improve teacher pedagogy through professional development opportunities that ensure they are equipped to meet the diverse needs of students.
- Increasing the capability of teachers to accurately assess and analyse reading progress through the case management process, to enable them to further deliver targeted teaching to meet student needs.
- Deepen curriculum and assessment knowledge of teachers through collaboration with teachers from local schools and Heads of Curriculum.
- Strengthen internal and external moderation practices for assessment to further develop teachers curriculum knowledge and enhance student academic outcomes.
- Purchase of additional literacy resources that allow for differentiation for student learning and lead to improved academic outcomes for students.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Engaging teachers in professional development in highly effective, research based pedagogical practices in reading \$ 8 000
- Purchase of additional literacy resources \$ 8 000
- Engage teachers in collaborative curriculum and assessment development \$4 098
- Engage a teacher aide to support students identified through case management process \$ 4 000
